Padraig also raised the results of our walkability audit. We have concerns about the lack of safe pedestrian access to the school with no proper zebra crossings in Eastgate, by Cork Plastics, etc. The Engineer said he would consider this request but didn't give any commitment to improve things. I am waiting for a response from the engineer. We may have to look at other ways of convincing the County Council to get this essential work done.
