# **Newsletter November 2013**

#### Dear Parents,

We have had a great month. I continue to be amazed by the commitment and generosity that our staff show every day. They are constantly looking for ways to go the extra mile for our students. We are very lucky to have them! Our pupils are doing their bit too and it really is a pleasure to come to work here when you are met by smiling, happy faces each day. There are just over three weeks to Christmas Holidays and while there will be lots of seasonal items being done in each class, there is a lot of work and revision to be done as well. Here's the news for this month.

**6**<sup>th</sup> **Class visit to UCC:** our 6<sup>th</sup> Class visited UCC this month for a tour of the grounds and facilities. They each received a graduation cert which hopefully is a sign of things to come. Third level education is what we hope that they all aspire to and giving our students the opportunity to look around the college will help with that.

**Swimming:** Swimming lessons will start for  $4^{th}-6^{th}$  Classes on Jan  $14^{th}$  2014. Our Parents Association are going to subsidise the bus for these lessons which means that the cost for the 6 lessons is  $\in 25$ . That is just over  $\in 4$  per lesson. Swimming is part of the PE Curriculum and as such is compulsory for all students.

**Basketball:** Mark Scannell continues with basketball coaching for 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> classes. He is planning a blitz for before Christmas. The children's skills have come on a lot in recent weeks and they are enjoying it.

This will give our boys and girls a chance to show off the skills that they have learned from Niall over the last few years. It will also give some of our younger footballers a chance to represent our school.

**Children's Achievements:** At assembly each week we try to acknowledge our students achievements inside and outside of school. We have a very talented bunch here with students taking part in swimming, gymnastics, tae kwon do, athletics, motor sport, soccer, GAA, Rugby, Drama, Art, Cubs, Scouts, Guides etc. The children really benefit from these activities but they require a major time commitment from parents. Our Active Diary is brought around each week to record examples of what children do at weekends to keep active and healthy.

**Board of Management:** At our recent Board meeting we reviewed our Child Protection Policy as per The Child Protection Guidelines. Everything is up to date and being done properly. Our staff are currently looking at the new Anti-Bullying Guidelines and our Board will discuss and update our Anti-Bullying Policy next term. Our current policy is available on our website. Our Board are looking at options for the future development of our school. We have an architect working on some options that the Board will decide on shortly. We will apply under the Summer Works Scheme for new toilets and hope that it will be approved. This work would take place next summer if approved.

**Science Week 2013:** all of our classes took part in Science Week this year. There were experiments of all sorts being conducted across the school! The children loved getting stuck into these. 3<sup>rd</sup> & 4<sup>th</sup> went to Blackrock Castle Observatory as well and were very well looked after. Science is for everyone and even getting your child to do some baking at home is a little bit of science!

**Green Schools:** Our next Flag is for Travel. In order to maintain our Green Schools status we have keep up the work. We must follow up on our work with Waste and Recycling, Energy and Water and move on to the Travel Flag. Ms. Walsh and Laura Daly will once

again coordinate our action plan but they will need to be supported by everyone in the school community. Sandy McGroarty from The Green Schools Programme visited our school this week and she will return next term to kick start our plan.
