## Dear Parents,

As our summer holidays are very close it is a time to look back at some of the highlights of the year. We have had a busy schedule and the time has flown by. ## September:

Our lunch time football leagues took place and there was huge interest in it. 5<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup> took part in The Cycle Sense Programme over a number of weeks.

## **October:**

Our Confirmation class had their Commitment Ceremony and our Holy Communion class had their Enrolment Ceremony. 4<sup>th</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> Class took part in Fit Factor and put a project together to enter the competition. Work continued on our applications for a Green Flag for Water, an Active Flag and a **Digital Schools Award.** 

#### **December:**

Our Junior and Senior Infant classes performed wonderful plays this week. It was lovely to see and it has helped to get us all into the festive spirit. 1<sup>st</sup> to 6<sup>th</sup> performed a selection of Christmas carols. Our Parents Association organised our annual Christmas Raffle which was another huge success. They also organised our school calendar with photos of all the children.

#### January:

"Here's a tip, don't let it drip", became our Green Schools motto for our work in the area of water conservation. Our Green Schools Committee was invited to Janssen to view their water treatment facility. Activity stations were set up on our yard at break time as part of our work towards an Active Flag. Some of our parents and staff started to train for the Cork City Marathon. 4<sup>th</sup> – 6<sup>th</sup> Class began swimming lessons this month.

## **February:**

2<sup>nd</sup> Class received their First Confession. Resource hours have been cut again this year. We are now receiving 75% of what we are entitled to. This means that we are short one full teacher on top of the other cuts to staff that we have suffered over recent years. Every child in our school, and indeed across the country, is losing out because of this. We will continue to do our best for you child(ren) with what we have. Please find attached to

this newsletter a notice regarding a protest against the cut to resources. This cut effects every child and not only those with Special Needs.

## Mouth guards/gum shields for football:

From the start of next year every child who takes part in football training and school matches will be required to wear a gum shield. This is in line with the GAA Directive that came into place on Jan 1<sup>st</sup> this year. Gum shields can be purchased in most sports shops for less than €5. Due to hygiene reasons we will not be able to provide gum shields here in school. It does not apply to PE lessons in general. It applies to training for Sciath na Scol and for Sciath na Scol matches. Our insurance company has advised to introduce this measure. Your child will not be allowed to play in Sciath na Scol football related activities without a gum shield.

# 6<sup>th</sup> Class Graduation:

Our 6<sup>th</sup> Class had their graduation ceremony earlier this month. It was a time to reflect on their time in school with us and to wish them well as they head off on the next stage of their lives. It was a pleasure to have had them as part of our school community and they have made our school a better place by being here.
