## **Newsletter April 2021**

#### Dear Parents,

Welcome to this month's newsletter. There has been lots of activity and energy in our school. It is a big improvement from twelve months ago when we were all trying to work from home. There is hope and optimism that we will get back to normal in the next few months. In the meantime, we need to be really careful and keep following public health advice.

Thank you to all of our families who continue to make responsible decisions that are keeping us all safe. I understand and appreciate that it isn't always convenient to have to keep your child at home, but your actions are keeping our school open for everyone. We are very grateful.

# **Drop off and Pick up:**

I would ask you to be conscious of our neighbours when you are parking outside the school. There are double yellow lines on the road so that traffic can flow safely – please do not park on the double yellow lines or in front of our neighbours. The Set Down area outside the school is for parents who are dropping their children and leaving so should be kept clear and not parked on. Please don't ask your child to cross the road to your car on their own. It is too dangerous so please get out of your car and make sure your child is safe.

## **Gardening and painting:**

We have been doing some work to improve our school environment recently. The muddy grass verge on the yard has been removed and a new sandpit has been installed. Our bench has been repainted to give it a new lease of life. The Cogan family and Aoife and Mick Glavin have put a lot of work into this and our school is a better place now. Thank you for your excellent work! 6<sup>th</sup> Class painted the wall around the pitch and refreshed our garden. They did an amazing job and we are all delighted with it. Well done girls and boys! We have booked a painter to paint the boundary walls at the front and rear of the school which will further improve things. We have lots more to do but it is all worth it when you see the end product. We can't do it on our own and we very much appreciate all of the help and support.

# **Board of Management:**

We had a Board of Management meeting this month. We have a very committed group of volunteers who provide great advice, guidance and support in the running of our school. We discussed plans for the next school year. As a school we are entering another phase in our history. In line with the population growth in the country, our school grew from a school with less than a hundred pupils to a school with just over 200 pupils. Now, as the population declines and there is a restricted supply of housing in Little Island, we are starting to reduce

in size again. The only change for next year will see me return to the classroom as a teaching principal. There will be further adjustments in the years to come. Our Board will work to mitigate these and make sure that our students continue to get the best possible education.
