Dear Parents,

I wrote the following paragraph this time last year. Never did I think that the same message would apply still at this point. Unfortunately it does, but I am very proud that our community has continued to stick together and work hard to keep our school open and as safe as possible.

As we reach the end of our third month back at school, I can't express how grateful I am to be part of this wonderful community. It is a privilege to be able to come to work here every day. With everything that is going on nationally and internationally it is great to be able to come to work with our excellent staff and pupils. You, as parents, continue to make responsible decisions that keep everyone in our school community safe. We can't drop our guard now and must continue to be careful so we can stay open. Together we have done very well and our children are benefitting from being able to come to school. Thank you.

Covid-19 update:

At the time of writing there have been some changes to our guidelines in schools. These impact our students, families and staff. From this week, if there is a positive case in a class I will inform the parents of children in the class, from JI to 1st Class and the children in the pod, from 3rd to 6th. These parents will be given a number to ring to order antigen tests for their child. This will be optional but provides an extra layer of protection for our community. It is important to remember that an antigen test can only be used when you have no symptoms. If you have symptoms, you need to get a PCR test. The government are currently deciding on the use of masks in primary school. I will pass this information on once we get it.

Parent/Teacher Meetings:

We held our Parent/Teacher meetings this month by phone. It was great to be able to speak to parents and to discuss our shared objective of helping each child to achieve their potential. Even though the formal meetings are over, we are still available to discuss any issues that may arise during the year. If you

have concerns, it is always better to discuss it with us at an early opportunity rather than waiting for it to build up.

PLC Day:

We had an in-service day this month to examine and discuss the Primary Language Curriculum. This was a worthwhile opportunity for our staff to work together in a way that isn't possible day to day. We will more in-service on this later in the year.

Board of Management Meeting:

Our Board of Management met this month. We discussed the ongoing Covid situation, staffing and the day to day running of the school. We also reviewed the following policies:

Italian Classes:
