# Dear Parents,

It is getting quite complicated as the normal winter colds and viruses are around again. We have a duty to the whole school community so we will have to take a common-sense approach. Ventilation is one of the best ways we have to prevent the spread of all viruses. Windows and doors will be opened regularly to change the air in the room. Again, we will take a common-sense approach in order to get the balance right between clean air and warmth/comfort. Children will need to dress appropriately with extra layers under their uniform when it gets colder.

# World Map:

Over the last month Ms. Ginevra has been working on a project to highlight the number of countries represented in our school community. Every country our children, or their parents, are from is marked on the map. We have 36 countries represented! This shows a fabulous wealth of cultures and experiences in our community.
