## Dear Parents,

It is hard to believe that we are at the end of our first month back already. The important routines have been set up in each class and staff and students are working hard. ## Parking:

# **Date for Parent Teacher Meetings:**

Our Parent Teacher meetings this year will take place on Wednesday 22nd and Thursday 23rd November. Meetings will take place after school on the 22<sup>nd</sup> and we will close at 1pm on the 23<sup>rd</sup> with meetings starting at 1.30pm. If these dates don't suit you, please contact your child's teacher to make a different arrangement. We will organise the meeting times after midterm break.

## Sciath na Scol:

Our school football teams have been taking part in the Sciath na Scol championship this month. They are representing our school really well and we are very proud of them. They are demonstrating a great attitude and lots of skill. Well done to all involved.

## Official School Opening and Closing times:

Children are supervised from 8.40am each morning. They go into their classes at 8.50am when teaching starts. Infants go home at 1.30pm and 1<sup>st</sup>-6<sup>th</sup> classes go home at 2.30pm. Outside of these times we are not responsible for your child(ren) unless they are on a school related activity. We cannot take responsibility for children who are dropped to school before 8.40am. ### **Allianz Insurance:**

Every child in our school is covered by the pupil personal accident 24hr insurance policy. The policy is valid from 1/9/2023-31/8/2024. ## **Post Primary Enrolment:**

In recent years there has been a growing demand for secondary school places in East Cork. Please be aware of the relevant closing dates for your preferred schools. They will all probably have waiting lists and if you miss the closing date you will be bottom of the list regardless of any other criteria. It is important to have a back-up plan, in case you don't get your first preference.

### **Credit Union:**

The Credit Union is back. They will visit every week on Wednesdays. If you can at all, encourage your child to save as it is a great life skill.

## Maths Week:

Maths Week will take place at the end of October. We have a workshop booked from The Lifetime Lab for 3<sup>rd</sup>-6<sup>th</sup> Classes. Each class will do different activities to mark the week. You can help too by involving your child in shopping (estimating the cost of items, paying for them, checking the change etc) or identifying shapes, looking at the different sizes of items by weight or volume etc.

## Covid-19:

While the future looks brighter this year, we still must be cautious. Schools, by their nature, are spreading grounds for viruses. The government has continued to provide funding for extra cleaning and sanitising. We will continue to encourage our children to wash their hands and to have good coughing etiquette as well as taking ventilation breaks.
